IMPORTANT NOTICE

2012 EXEMPTION RENEWALS ONLY

If you qualified for exemption in 2011, you are not required to file an annual affidavit unless you have changes or answer yes to any of the questions below. If you answer yes, make the changes on the affidavit you receive in the mail in January 2012, and return to our office.

If there are no changes, you are not required to return the affidavit and you will receive your exemption.

- Does your household income exceed \$29,421 with no children under 18 in the home or \$35,305 with children under 18 in the home?
- Does the 2012 Assessed Value of all your property in Arizona exceed \$23,705?
- If you were exempt as a Widow or Widower in 2011, have you remarried?
- If you received exemption as a disabled person, has your medical status changed?
- Have you changed your deed or title? (Added or removed names etc.)
- Is your name on a deed or title not listed on the affidavit?
- Do you receive exemption on a vehicle?
- Do you receive an exemption in another county? (Please indicate this on the affidavit.)

It is important to consider that a failure to disclose changes to the Assessor will result in the adjusting or removing of your exemption from the time that the Assessor finds that a change has occurred. This may result in a tax liability of more than one year. Exempt amounts, assessed value and allowable income amounts will change each year.
